

Make Your Own Lion Bookmark

Although lions are very fierce and have no natural predators, according to the World Wildlife Fund, their populations have declined by 40% in the last three generations!

This decline is partly due to a reduction in their natural habitat (which means that areas, where they live are being changed or destroyed). It is also because human beings still hunt lions. With only around 20,000 in the wild, African Lions are officially classified as 'vulnerable'.

Instructions

1. Cut a square of paper and colour it in yellow.



2. Fold the square in half to make a triangle.



3. Take one layer of paper, grab the top corner of the triangle, and fold it down to the bottom of the triangle.



4. Take the bottom right-hand corner of the triangle and fold it into the middle of the triangle (at the bottom).



- 5. Then do the same with the left-hand corner and unfold.
- 6. Take the right-hand corner again and this time, fold it up to the top corner of the triangle.



7. Do the same with the left-hand corner.



8. Now, take these flaps and tuck them into the pocket you've made.

You've now made an origami bookmark!

To decorate it to look like a lion, start by drawing a mane around the top of the triangle on another sheet of paper, colour it in, cut it out and stick it to the top of your lion's head.



9. Then draw a red mouth for the lion, cut out some jagged teeth and stick them to the inside of the mouth.



10. Finally, add some features to the lion's face like some googly eyes and a button nose. You can do these by cutting them out and sticking them on, or just by drawing them straight on, get creative!
